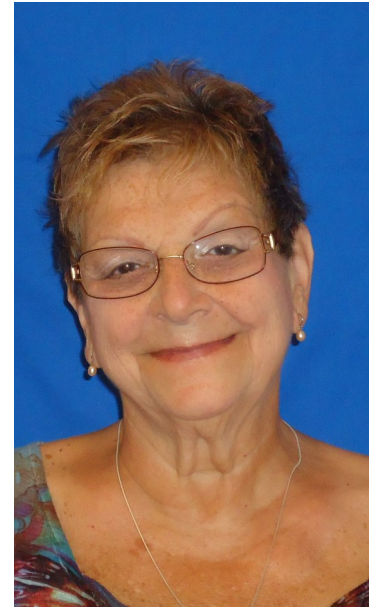
2015 Facts:
